		Students who do not demonstrate the required English proficiency scores, but are academically qualified, may be considered for admission to the Intensive English Language Institute (IELI) on the Logan campus. If admitted, students complete required English language courses before beginning their academic coursework. If an exchange student tests out of IELI, they would be free to take regular university classes. If an exchange student gets a high
	What if you don't have an English score?	score (as determined by our IELI director), but the score is not quite passing and they want to take regular university classes with no IELI classes, it would be reviewed on a case-by-case basis. Students in this case would also be able to take a mix of both IELI and regular university classes if they wish.
		If an exchange student does not get a high enough score, they will be required to take IELI classes. They may be allowed to take some university level classes on a case-bycase basis alongside their IELI courses at the discretion of the IELI director. Undergraduate students who believe they
		demonstrate English language proficiency should complete the English Language Proficiency Appeal form.
